Job Title: Trainer/Equipment Manager

Duties of an Equipment Manager/Trainer are as follows:

- Management, upkeep and repair of player equipment;
- Skate maintenance and sharpening;
- Prepare and maintain a safe and clean dressing room space, including:
 - Stall preparation
 - Ensuring proper drying techniques
 - General dressing room upkeep
- Team supply setup and maintenance;
- Laundry, if applicable;
- Bench setup, including but not limited to:
 - Water bottles
 - Towels
 - o Bench tape
 - Wax
 - o Pucks
- Ensure all team equipment complies with Hockey NL and Hockey Canada rules and regulations.

Additional Trainer Duties are as follows:

- Emergency response on ice and off ice as required;
- Ensure safe handover of any injured player to appropriate medical response teams;
- Assessment and treatment of player injuries before, during and after games, and/or practices;
- Document all injuries according to Hockey NL and Hockey Canada policy;
- Reporting all injuries to coaching staff in a timely and professional manor;
- Providing nutritional/hydration advice to players for pre-game, in game and post -game meals and snacks as well as monitoring in accordance with appropriate medical advice;
- Ensure supplies for are available for nutrition tables
- Secure appropriate nutrition and supplies for the team under the direction of the Director of Operations;
- Provide all receipts to the Director of Operations for any/all supplies secured for team operations;
- Management of pre-game warm-up and post-game cool-down;
- Restocking basic medical supplies as suggested by Chief Medical Officer of Hockey NL;
- Must be available to assist in summer camp set-up for your team

If working a tournament such as the Atlantic Challenge Cup where there are more than one Newfoundland and Labrador team present, you are expected to assist and work as a team with all Trainers involved, while overseeing the team you are attending with.
